### Churchill dead, speech in limbo

### More Money For Drew

The students of Drew University would like to make it known that we fully understand any tuition increase that the Administration would care to make. We understand how hard it can be to balance a budget and would like the Administration to know that we are behind them 100 percent on any foreseeable tuition increase; even though raising tuition can be a bit of an inconvenience, we are all so enamored with Drew that none of us could ever think of our University without all of the expense accounts that the Administration needs. In any case, the students spend most of their money on frivolous items, and very few have any real need for financial aid. It would probably increase the University's economic health if the administration cut down on the financial aid to those students who show no need; it would also make the tuition costs equal to other universities of a similar type like Weskru U.—located in Overpriced, New Jersey—or our sister school Finanshell Burden—located in scenic Monypitt, N.J.

When you love something as much as Drew, money is simply no object. *The Acron* strongly supports any proposed raise in tuition as a fair and decent way of allowing the student community to prove that it truly loves Drew.
