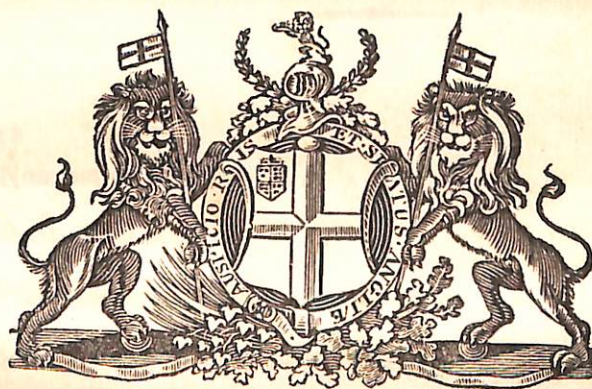

STATUTES.

STATUTE I. *Nomination of Students.*

1. No young man who has been in the Army or Navy will be nominated to the College; but this Statute is not to affect any one who, previously to the 14th July 1815, may have quitted either of those lines, with a view to the East-India service, and may have qualified himself by education for admission into the College.
2. No young man will be nominated to the College who has been expelled from any place of education.
3. No person shall, in future, be nominated to the College as a Student till he has completed the sixteenth year of his age.

Rank of Students.

STAT. II.
Rank

1. The rank of all the Students now in the College, or who may hereafter be nominated thereto, shall be determined by no other rule than the certificate of the College Council, which shall be granted with reference to the industry, proficiency, and general good behaviour of the Students, and that the certificate shall be of three kinds.

The first shall be given to those who possess the highest degree of merit.

The second, to those who have distinguished themselves by general good behaviour and attention, both to the rules of the College and to their studies; and

The third to those, of whom nothing more can be said, than that they have conformed themselves to the Statutes and Regulations of the College.

2. The general form of certificate prescribed in the twelfth section of the tenth Statute shall, in every particular case, be

so

so far varied and modified, as to render it conformable to the tenor of the certificate here described.

3. No such certificate to be valid, unless signed or authorized by five out of eight Members of the College Council.

STATUTE III.

Punishment of Students in certain Cases.

1. In cases of improper behaviour, where, from a number of Students being present (whether at Lectures, Hall, Chapel, or elsewhere) the offender cannot be detected, a selection will be made of those most likely to be concerned, who, on their inability to clear themselves, and declining to give up the delinquent, will be subject to punishment according to the nature of the offence.

2. In case of any gross act of insubordination being committed, the author or authors of which cannot be discovered, the Council shall select from the body of the Students among whom the act took place, those who, from their general habits,

STAT. III. are most likely to be concerned, separating them from those
 Punishment whose general habits do not bring them under suspicion ; and
 of Students. of those so selected, a certain portion, according to circum-
 stances, shall be immediately rusticated with the loss of a
 term, or expelled the College.

REGULATIONS.

SECTION I.

[Supplementary to Statute VII. Clause 4.]

Duties of Professors.

All the Professors, whether Laymen or Clergymen, and whether resident in the College or out of it, shall in future take an active part in its daily routine.

SECTION II.

Declarations required to be made by Students, and their Parents, Guardians, or recommending Friends.

1. Every Student, and his Parents or Guardian, will be required to make a declaration in writing, addressed to the Director who has nominated him (which declaration shall be presented by the said Director to the Court), disavowing the principle

SECT. II. principle of maintaining an obstinate silence, and refusing even
Declarations of Students, &c. to speak to his own innocence, when he can justly do so, in case of any act of insubordination occurring at the College. The same parties will likewise be required to state, in the same way, that it is with the free choice and liking of the Student that he goes to the College, and is ultimately destined for India. These declarations are to be renewed every term.

2. The Parent or recommending Friend of every Student will be required, at the commencement of the first and of the third term, to address the following declaration to the nominating Director, to be by him presented to the Court.

“ SIR,

“ I have perused the *Observations* circulated by order
“ of the Court *on the personal Expenses of the Students at*
“ *the East-India College at Hertford.* I approve of them,
“ and hereby promise to conform to them, and to use my
“ utmost endeavours that the rules proposed in them, respect-
“ ing the scale of pocket-money, and not contracting debt
“ without the previous assent of the Principal or Registrar,
“ shall be strictly observed by my ————.”

First Term probationary.

By the regulations already established, the whole time passed at the College by the Students is probationary; but, in future, the first term is to be considered as such in a more particular sense: and if any Student shall not, in the judgment of the College Council, give satisfaction in that term, he will not be permitted to return to the College.

Appointment of Seniors.

A certain number of the senior Students shall be appointed over the other Students. Each of the Seniors shall have about ten Students under his care; and those Seniors, who acquit themselves well, will be suitably distinguished.
