## Study Materials for the Student Christian Movement

The cover artist is Corrine Niedenthal, and originally the art work appeared in the National Lutheran Council, Division of College and University Work, series on The Renewal of the Mind. The artist offers this explanation of her work:

God's desire is that man be not conformed to this world, but be transformed and grow by "the renewal of the mind," surrendering himself into the hand of God and growing in Christ, who sacrificed Himself on the Cross. (Held in the Hand, the symbol of God, is man, shown in a series of growing forms, with the Cross of Christ at the heart.)

# Rouault Travelling Art Exhibit

## "BEHOLD THE MAN"

Sponsored by the Division of Christian Education  
of the National Council of Churches, through  
the National Student Christian Federation

This exhibit is basically the one prepared during Lent of 1956 by Mr. Harvey Cox, then with the staff of the YMCA at Oberlin College in Ohio. There are a few changes in the text plates and one different picture.

The "Behold the Man" Exhibit consists of ten plates from George Rouault's *Miserere* Series and one colored etching of the head of Christ. The accompanying text includes readings of various kinds (literature, homiletics, journalism), biblical passages and prayers.

Readings and pictures provide a meditation on the suffering and redeeming Christ. In *Behold the Man: Meditations on the Meaning of the Cross*,\* Mr. Cox says: "The poems and readings . . . are an attempt to express verbally what Rouault says in paint—that Christian faith begins where man faces and accepts his own sin and lostness. The readings are coordinated with biblical passages and the paintings trace the movement of the Passion story through tragedy and estrangement to the healing and wholeness of God's forgiving deed in Jesus the Christ."

Requests for the Exhibit may be made at any time during the year. The main scheduling for the September-May academic year, however, is usually done in the previous June. Please list alternate dates in any request.

The cost of the Exhibit is \$65 for one week, plus Railway Express charges to the place of the next showing.
